6.B Resolution No. 11-2026. A Resolution amending the City of Kerrville fee schedule by revising the Stormwater Fees.

6.C Request for a waiver from the City's policy to allow water and sewer extensions outside the city limits on an unimproved tract located between Cotton Gin Ln. and Oak Dr. and located north of the intersection of State Highway 27 and the property addressed as 2190 State Highway 27 (Junction Hwy), such property consisting of approximately .5 acres.

Councilmember McKinney made a motion to deny the request for waiver at 2190 Highway 27, seconded by Councilmember Harris. Motion to deny the waiver passed 5-0.

6.D Discussion and possible action regarding the City Attorney recruitment process, including committee appointment.

City Council made a determination and directed staff to utilize the Human Resource Department to manage the recruitment process, advertise the position, and screen applications according to City Council direction; and appoint Councilmember Sigerman and Councilmember McKinney as Council liaison as the development and consultant team. Councilmember Harris made a motion as such, seconded by Councilmember Hughes. Motion approved 5-0.

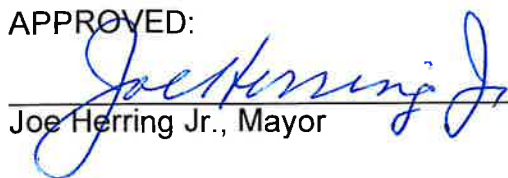
